Manitowoc Police Department Monthly Report April 2009



The Manitowoc Police Department's Monthly Reports are an estimation of activity received from the Joint Dispatch Center. True and accurate reports and statistics can be obtained on the annual report, as further investigation into these complaints may reveal a different type of call and/or situation than what was originally reported.

For the month, the Manitowoc Police Department received **2,344 CALLS FOR SERVICE**, which resulted in **1,321 INCIDENTS/COMPLAINTS** being investigated by the department. The Manitowoc Police Department takes pride in our high standards of providing public safety to our community, and within this report are some examples where this is making a difference.

Each jurisdiction submits monthly reports to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, which collects and reports crime offense data for the Nation as Part I and Part II crimes. This is essential to maintain the uniformity and consistency of data nation wide.

The Manitowoc Police Department recorded 52 Part I Crimes (see below for details) for this month. The Part II offenses encompass all other crime classifications outside those defined as Part I.

It should be noted, that this does not reflect all Part I Crimes for the month due to continuing investigations.

- **Murder/Non-Negligent** – the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
- **Forcible Rape** – the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.
- **Robbery** – the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
- **Assault(s)** – an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
- **Burglary** – the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.
- **Larceny/Theft** – the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Motor Vehicle Theft is not included. All theft and attempted thefts are counted.
- **Motor Vehicle Thefts** – the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is classified as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails.
- **Arson** – any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

Manitowoc Police Department State Arrests - Juvenile/Adult April 2009

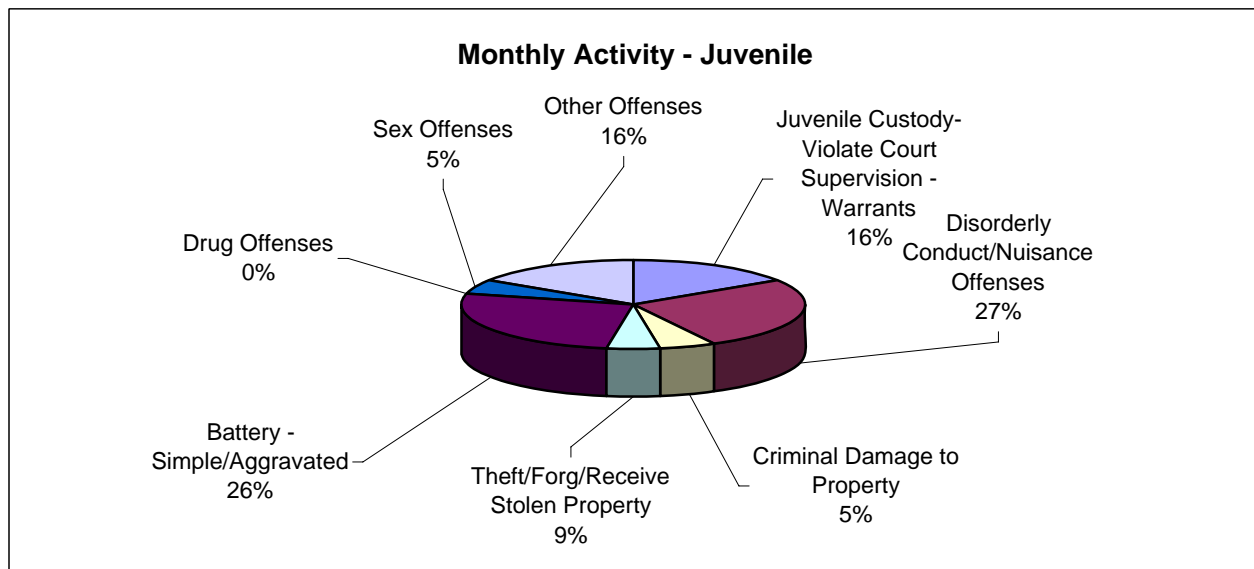

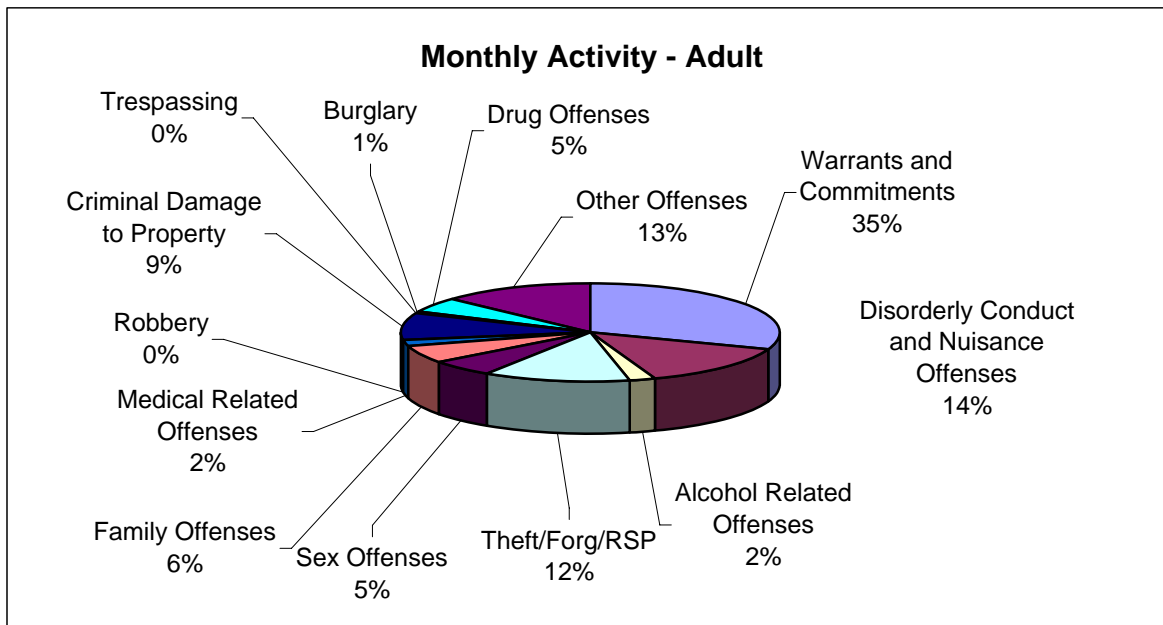

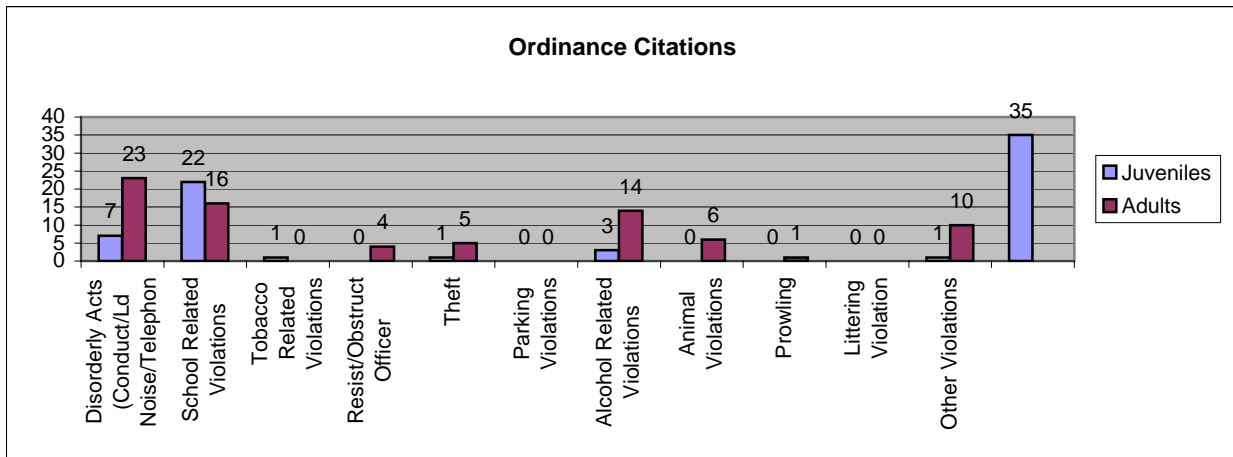

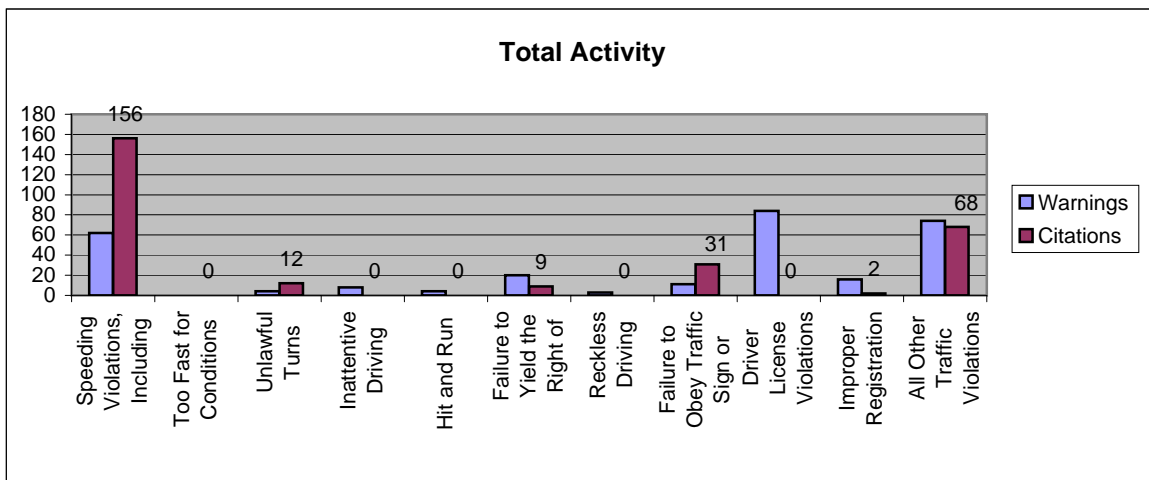

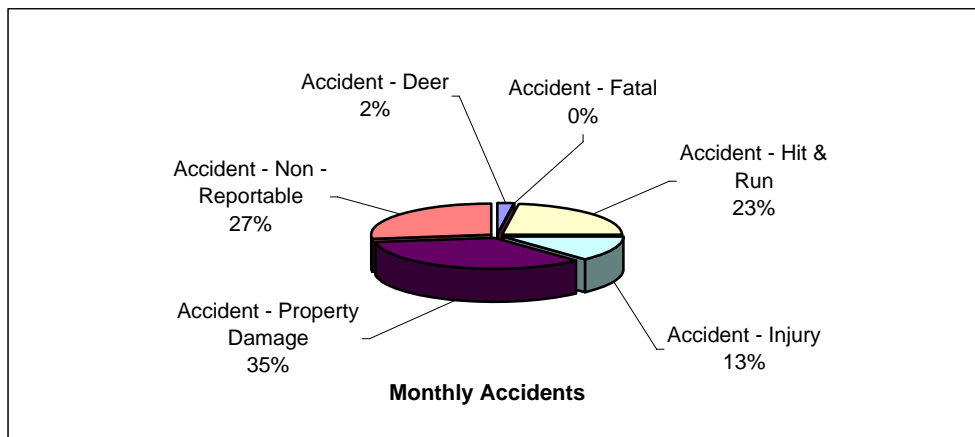

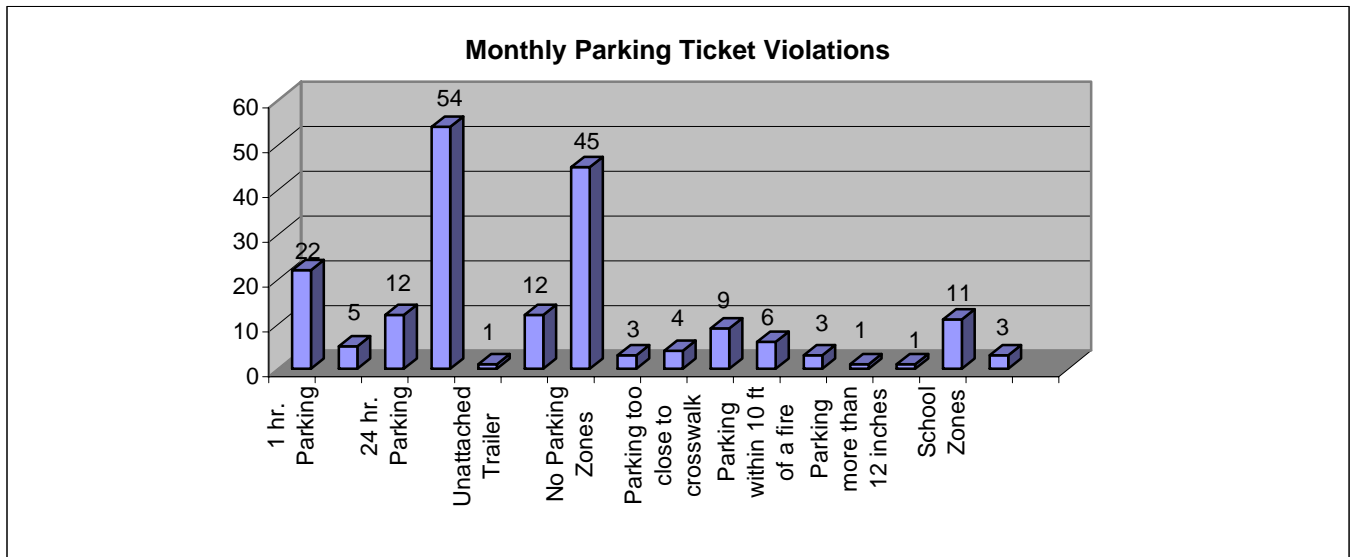

Patrol/Investigations

The Patrol Division consists of officers that patrol our neighborhoods, check our businesses during and after business hours and respond to alarms, rescue calls and other calls for service. Officers are trained and certified in a number of disciplines, including traffic law enforcement, OWI detection and enforcement, and interviews and interrogations. Some officers are certified accident investigators and evidence technicians, while some have attended gang recognition schools and drug recognition classes.

Investigators are primarily responsible for the investigation of major crimes such as homicide, sexual assault, burglary, robbery, forgery and fraud. Those assigned to these crimes have developed an advanced level of expertise by attending specialized training and through years of experience working on complex cases with colleagues at the state and local levels.

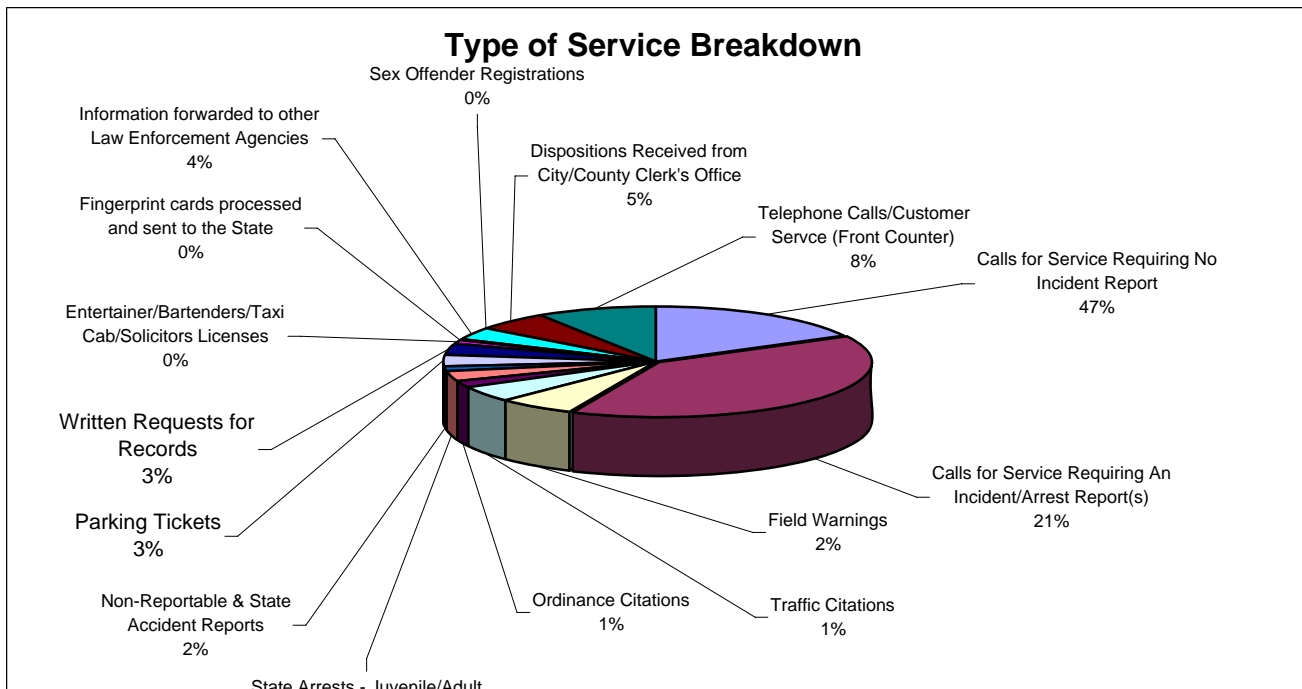

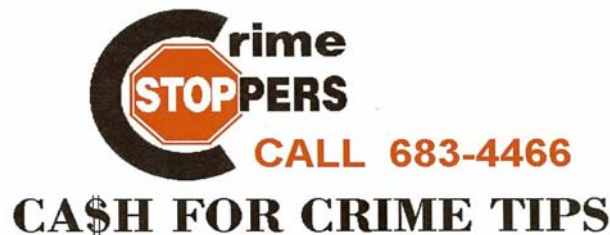
On April 3, 2009 a 19-year-old male and a 26 year-old-female were jailed for felony bail jumping, according to Manitowoc Police Department reports. The two are to have no contact with each other as a condition of bail from a March 31st drug incident. The two were found together in a residence in the 1600 block of Washington Street. The female was arrested for bail jumping after she and the 19-year-old were found together in the 3700 block of Dale Street, the male left on foot before the police arrived.

On April 9, 2009 a 22-year-old male was arrested for allegedly punching his girlfriend in the face four times after she accused him of cheating on her, according to Manitowoc Police Department reports. The suspect faces a charge of domestic violence-related conduct. The incident occurred around 4:40 p.m. in the 300 block of North Sixth Street.

On April 11, 2009 a 40-year-old female and a 54-year-old male were arrested for allegedly drinking in violation of probation and bail restrictions against them, according to Manitowoc Police Department reports. The female was jailed for felony bail jumping, while the male was jailed on a probation hold. An anonymous complaint alerted police to their situation in the 700 block of East Albert Drive. This marked the female's seventh bail jumping arrest this year. A preliminary breath test showed she had 0.210 percent blood alcohol content, and the male had 0.267 percent blood alcohol content.

On April 11, 2009 a 21-year-old male was arrested after he allegedly grabbed his wife by the neck, pushed her onto a couch and broke her cell phone during an argument, according to Manitowoc Police Department reports. The suspect faces charges of domestic violence-related disorderly conduct and criminal damage to property. The incident took place around 3 a.m. in the 2100 block of South 10th Street.

On April 11, 2009 a 21-year-old female was jailed for allegedly pushing her mom to the ground during an argument, causing pain to the woman's head, back and ribs, according to Manitowoc Police Department reports. The suspect faces a charge of domestic violence-related disorderly conduct. The incident occurred at 4:25 p.m. in the 2000 block of Johnston Drive.
