Manitowoc Police Department Monthly Report February 2009



The Manitowoc Police Department's Monthly Reports are an estimation of activity received from the Joint Dispatch Center. True and accurate reports and statistics can be obtained on the annual report, as further investigation into these complaints may reveal a different type of call and/or situation than what was originally reported.

For the month, the Manitowoc Police Department received **2,014 CALLS FOR SERVICE**, which resulted in **1,145 INCIDENTS/COMPLAINTS** being investigated by the department. The Manitowoc Police Department takes pride in our high standards of providing public safety to our community, and within this report are some examples where this is making a difference.

Each jurisdiction submits monthly reports to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, which collects and reports crime offense data for the Nation as Part I and Part II crimes. This is essential to maintain the uniformity and consistency of data nation wide.

The Manitowoc Police Department recorded 46 Part I Crimes (see below for details) for this month. The Part II offenses encompass all other crime classifications outside those defined as Part I.

It should be noted, that this does not reflect all Part I Crimes for the month due to continuing investigations.

- **Murder/Non-Negligent** – the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
- **Forcible Rape** – the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.
- **Robbery** – the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
- **Assault(s)** – an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
- **Burglary** – the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.
- **Larceny/Theft** – the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Motor Vehicle Theft is not included. All theft and attempted thefts are counted.
- **Motor Vehicle Thefts** – the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is classified as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails.
- **Arson** – any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

Manitowoc Police Department State Arrests - Juvenile/Adult February 2009

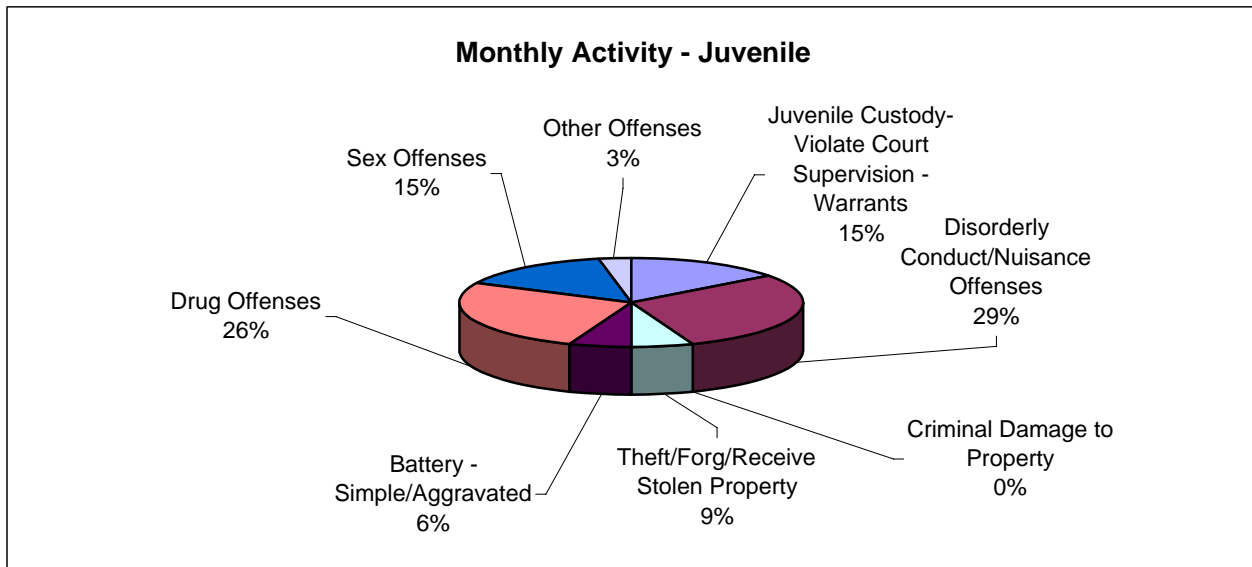

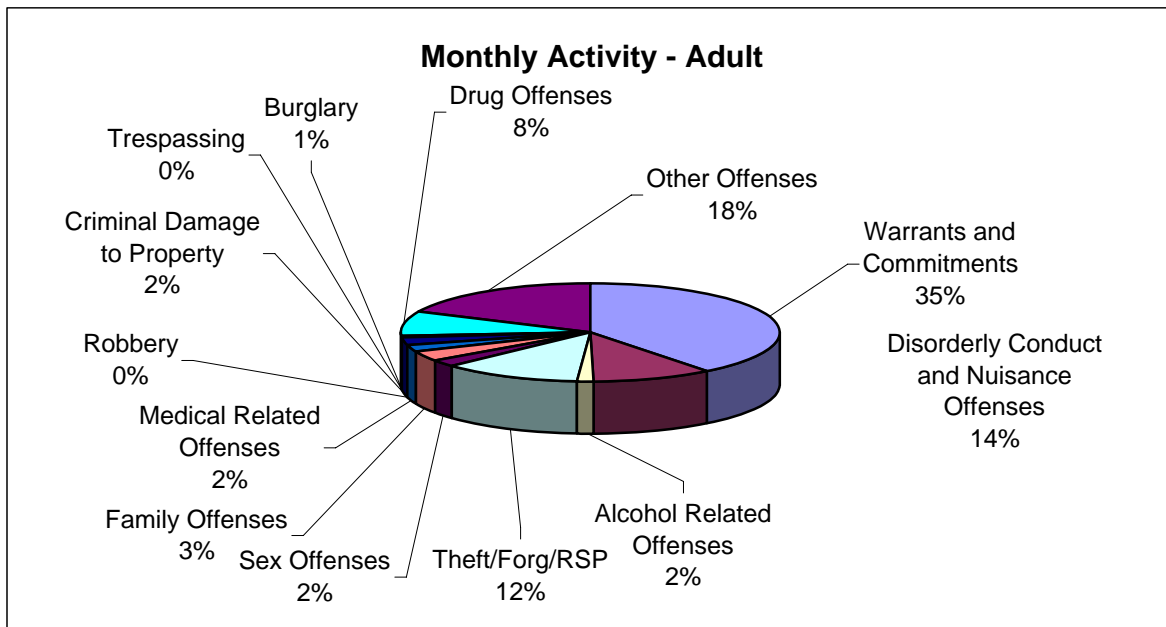

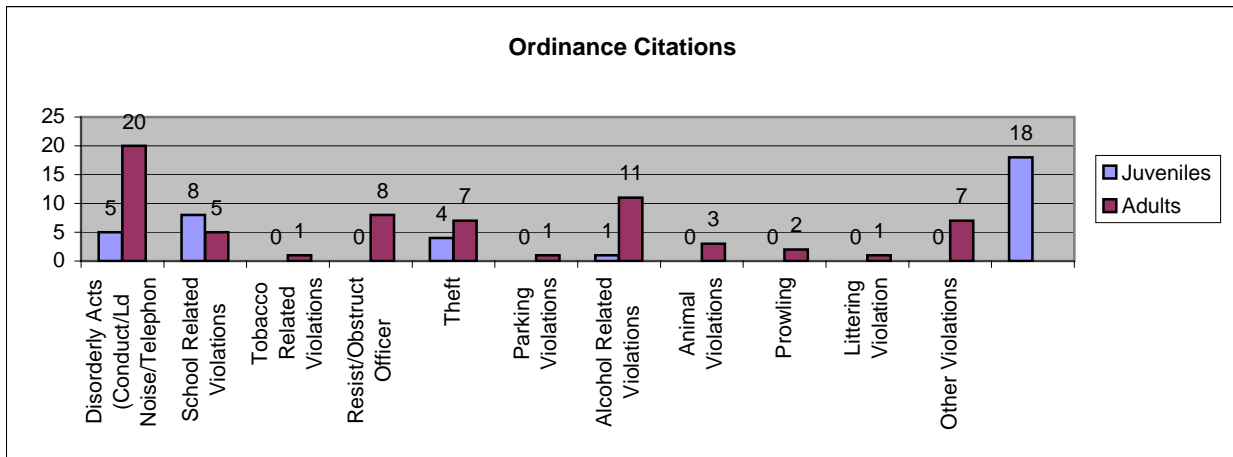

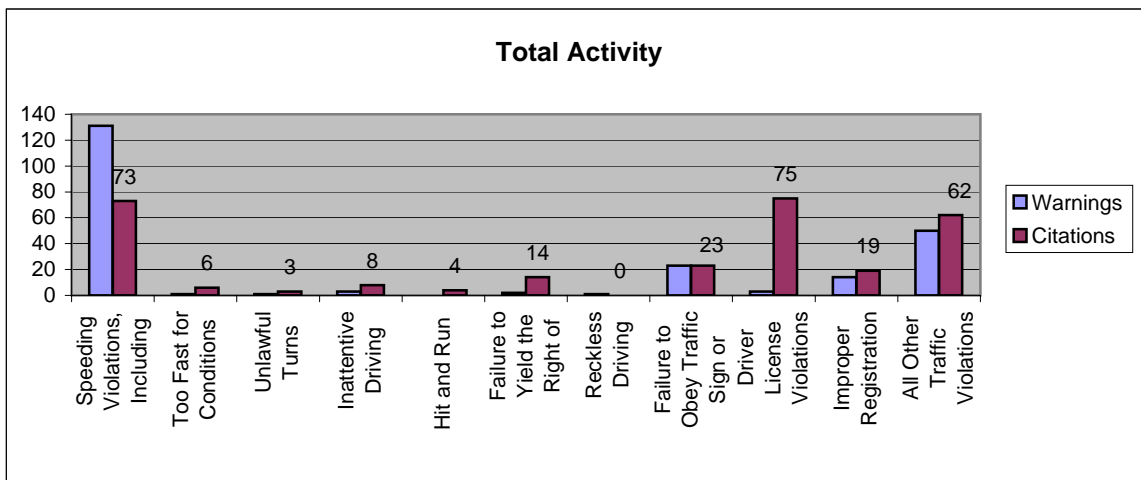

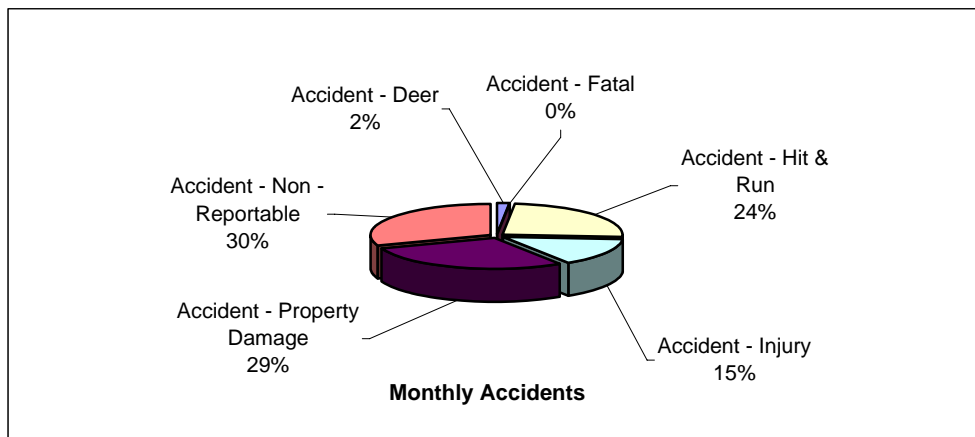

Patrol/Investigations

The Patrol Division consists of officers that patrol our neighborhoods, check our businesses during and after business hours and respond to alarms, rescue calls and other calls for service. Officers are trained and certified in a number of disciplines, including traffic law enforcement, OWI detection and enforcement, and interviews and interrogations. Some officers are certified accident investigators and evidence technicians, while some have attended gang recognition schools and drug recognition classes.

Investigators are primarily responsible for the investigation of major crimes such as homicide, sexual assault, burglary, robbery, forgery and fraud. Those assigned to these crimes have developed an advanced level of expertise by attending specialized training and through years of experience working on complex cases with colleagues at the state and local levels.

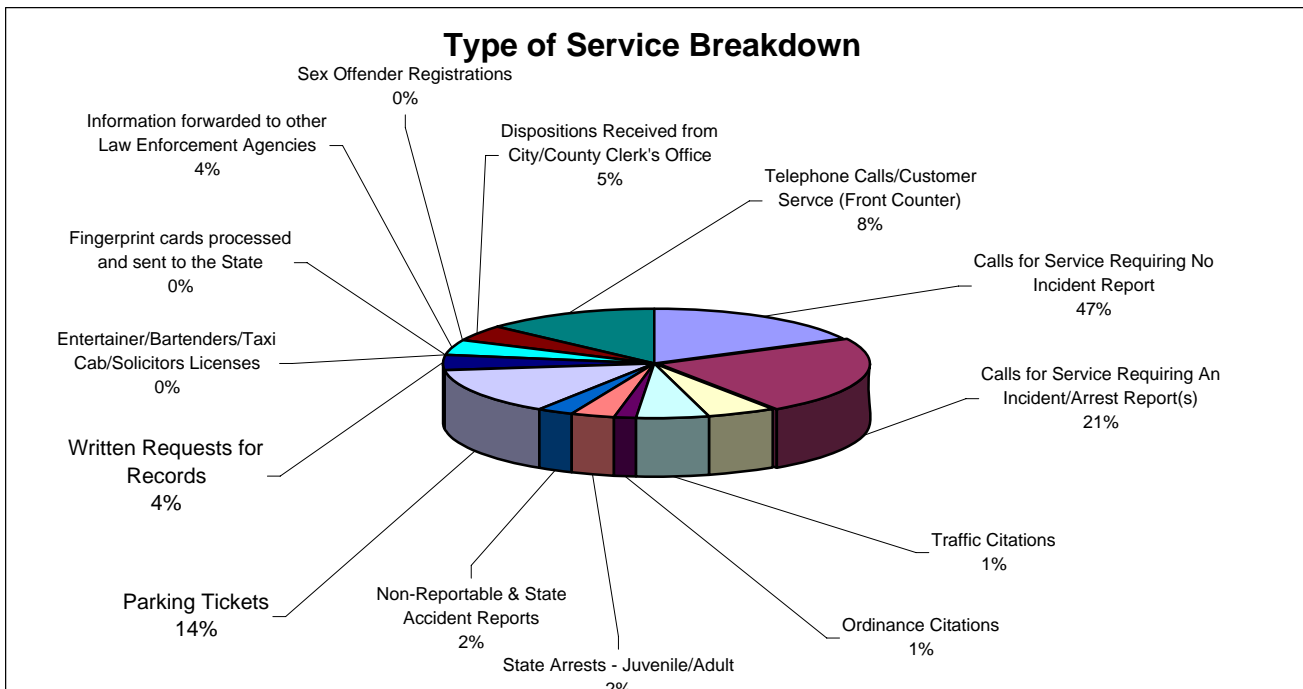

News Releases for February 2009

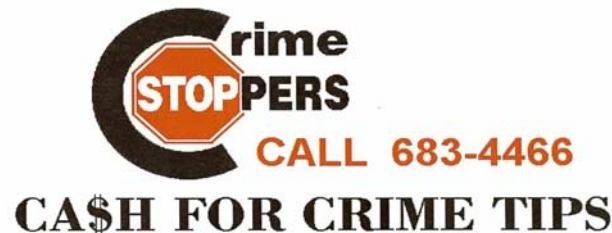
On February 5, 2009 a 40-year-old Manitowoc woman who allegedly stomped on a police officers' foot last month while getting a medical evaluation was found drunk Thursday in violation of her bail. The suspect was taken to jail at 1:16 am Thursday for bail jumping. Her blood alcohol content measured at 0.345. The suspect was the subject of a complaint Thursday of harassing phone calls. When police located the suspect to question her about the allegation, officers found her intoxicated, with blood shot eyes, slurred speech and a heavy odor of intoxicants. The suspect was ordered to maintain absolute sobriety from the previous incident with the officer, and as a condition of a prior domestic violence incident, was to have no contact with the man who she was found with.

On February 5, 2009 a 43-year-old Manitowoc man who was jailed Wednesday for allegedly pulling his wife's hair out in a domestic dispute was sent back to the jail Thursday after he was found sleeping in a closet in the couple's home. The suspect faces charges of domestic violence-related disorderly conduct and violating a temporary domestic abuse injunction. The incidents occurred in the 2000 block of Johnston Drive. Officers received a call around 4 pm Wednesday from the suspect's stepson, who said his mother, who does not speak English, wanted the police notified of domestic abuse that took place earlier that day. When officers and a translator arrived on scene, the woman told police the suspect had pulled her hair out, pushed her onto a bed and covered her mouth with his hand during a dispute about the father of her children. The woman's two grandchildren witnessed the incident and cried throughout the fight. Police located and questioned the suspect at his place of employment, then arrested and jailed him. He was ordered not to contact his wife for 72 hours, and then released on bail. At 11:00 am Thursday, the woman reported to police that she found the suspect sleeping in a closet of the couple's residence. He also allegedly called her cell phone and left her a note earlier in the day. Officers located the suspect at a bar shortly after and returned him to jail.

On February 6, 2009 a 42-year-old Manitowoc man who was sentenced on Friday to two years probation on domestic violence offenses was jailed just hours later when he intentionally stole from area convenience stores to get his probation revoked. The suspect now faces two counts of retail theft. He was arrested at 12:30 am Saturday at the Manitowoc County Jail, where he had arrived to turn himself in. The suspect allegedly told police he stole drinks and snacks from the Kwik Trip on Washington and North Eighth Streets in an attempt to have his probation revoked. He said he did so because he would not be able to comply with the two-year order of absolute sobriety. But because his new sentence had been in place for just a few hours, officers did not have record of the suspect's probation terms and were unable to jail him for violating the agreement. When police told him he could be released, the suspect allegedly said he would continue to steal from Kwik Trips until he was arrested. He also allegedly made statements about harming his parents.

On February 27, 2009, a 47-year old Manitowoc man was arrested for allegedly hitting his girlfriend in the face during an argument about alcohol and cigarettes. The suspect was jailed shortly after 10 pm and faces a charge of domestic violence – related battery. Police found evidence of a struggle in the couple's shared home, and the suspect's girlfriend later said she feared for her safety.

On February 28, 2009 a 22-year-old Manitowoc man who pushed and threatened to kick officers as he had blood drawn at a local hospital was jailed over the weekend for resisting an officer. The suspect was in custody for operating while intoxicated when officers took him to a hospital to record his blood alcohol content, according to police. While there, he allegedly made several threats of violence, threatened to kick the officers, and pushed his chest and shoulder into one officer, causing him to fall back.

“Highlights on February’s Investigations”



On February 4, 2009 a 24-year-old Manitowoc man who police say repeatedly punched the mother of his child and said he didn’t care if he killed her faces charges of battery and bail jumping, according to Manitowoc Police Department. The male suspect was jailed Wednesday morning following the incident, which occurred in the 1000 block of South 12th Street. The alleged incident was in violation of the bail agreement from a previous disorderly conduct offense. According to police, the male suspect and the woman got into a verbal argument around 11 am Wednesday about the size of their 4-month-old child. The argument turned physical when the male allegedly punched the woman in the back of her head and the middle of her back, causing her to fall to the floor. The male suspect then allegedly wrapped his arm around her neck, began to choke her and said he didn’t care if he killed her. He then released her and left the room. Officers say the woman followed the male into the other room, where he punched her in the face several times before she left the residence.



On February 5, 2009, a 21-year-old Manitowoc man was charged with attempted burglary from the alleged December 1 break-in according to the complaint. The suspect’s ex-girlfriend told a Manitowoc police officer that her mother had dropped off a load of pumpkin raisin bread at her apartment on December 1. Two bites were taken out of each side of the loaf. The exterior door also was damaged with numerous pry marks. The suspect told police he pried on the door for about an hour but was unable to enter the apartment. He also said he tore chunks off the bread and threw it down the stairs. The suspect was also charged Tuesday with two counts of burglary from two alleged unrelated break-ins. According to the criminal complaint, the Manitowoc Police

Department responded to a home in the 700 block of South 16th Street after a man returned home from taking his child trick or treating October 31 to find the trim molding on his door damaged. The man told police he was missing his oxycodone and methadone prescriptions. The suspect told police he had entered the home and took the drugs along with \$7 or \$8 in change. A woman reported to police that her purse was taken from her residence while she was sleeping the night of November 30. The woman also notice a can of 7UP and bottled water on the kitchen counter that was not there before she went to bed. The woman told police she suspected that her son, who she identified as the suspect, might have been involved because of his past actions. The suspect admitted to police that he stole his mother's purse and prescription drugs that were in the purse.



February 6, 2009: The Manitowoc Police Department is looking to the public for information on a burglary on The Last Call bar, 1134 South 10th Street, and three “persons of interest” who were photographed at a nearby convenience store shortly after the break-in. The burglary took place after the bar closed early Friday morning, according to Detective Mike Stone. An undetermined amount of cash was reported stolen. Police are asking for help in identifying two men and one woman who were seen walking into Kwik Trip from the bar around the time of the incident.
