# Manitowoc Police Department Monthly Report October 2008



The Manitowoc Police Department's Monthly Reports are an estimation of activity received from the Joint Dispatch Center. True and accurate reports and statistics can be obtained on the annual report, as further investigation into these complaints may reveal a different type of call and/or situation than what was originally reported.

For the month, the Manitowoc Police Department received **2,447 CALLS FOR SERVICE**, which resulted in **1,461 INCIDENTS/COMPLAINTS** being investigated by the department. The Manitowoc Police Department takes pride in our high standards of providing public safety to our community, and within this report are some examples where this is making a difference.

Each jurisdiction submits monthly reports to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, which collects and reports crime offense data for the Nation as Part I and Part II crimes. This is essential to maintain the uniformity and consistency of data nation wide.

The Manitowoc Police Department recorded 83 Part I Crimes (see below for details) for this month. The Part II offenses encompass all other crime classifications outside those defined as Part I.

It should be noted, that this does not reflect all Part I Crimes for the month due to continuing investigations.

- **Murder/Non-Negligent** – the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
- **Forcible Rape** – the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.
- **Robbery** – the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
- **Assault(s)** – an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
- **Burglary** – the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.
- **Larceny/Theft** – the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Motor Vehicle Theft is not included. All theft and attempted thefts are counted.
- **Motor Vehicle Thefts** – the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is classified as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails.
- **Arson** – any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

# Manitowoc Police Department State Arrests - Juvenile/Adult October 2008

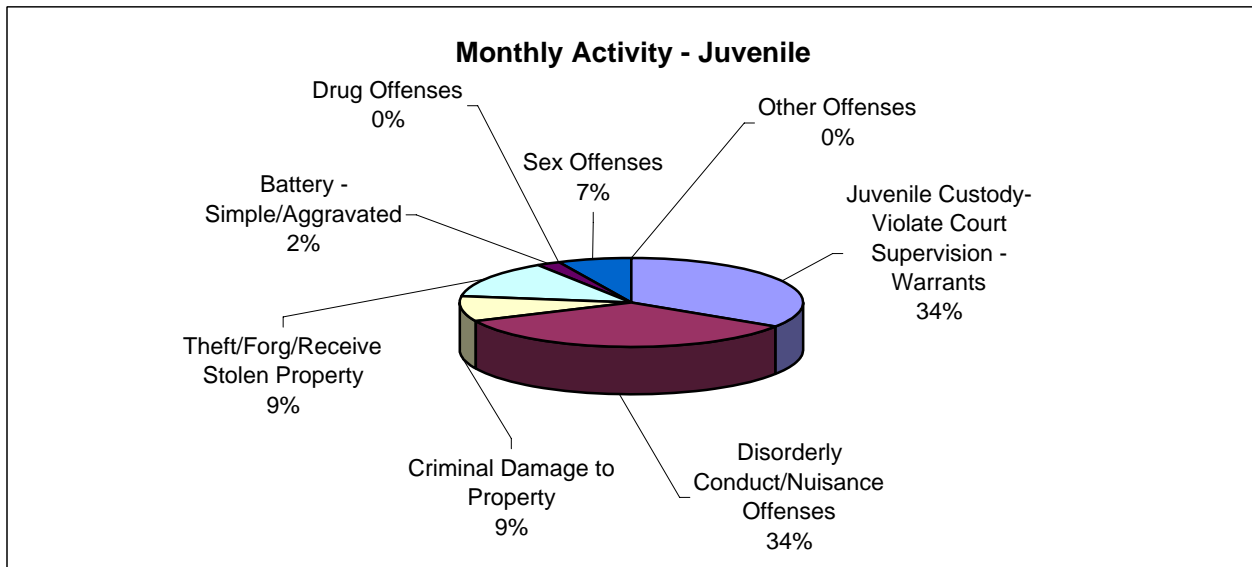

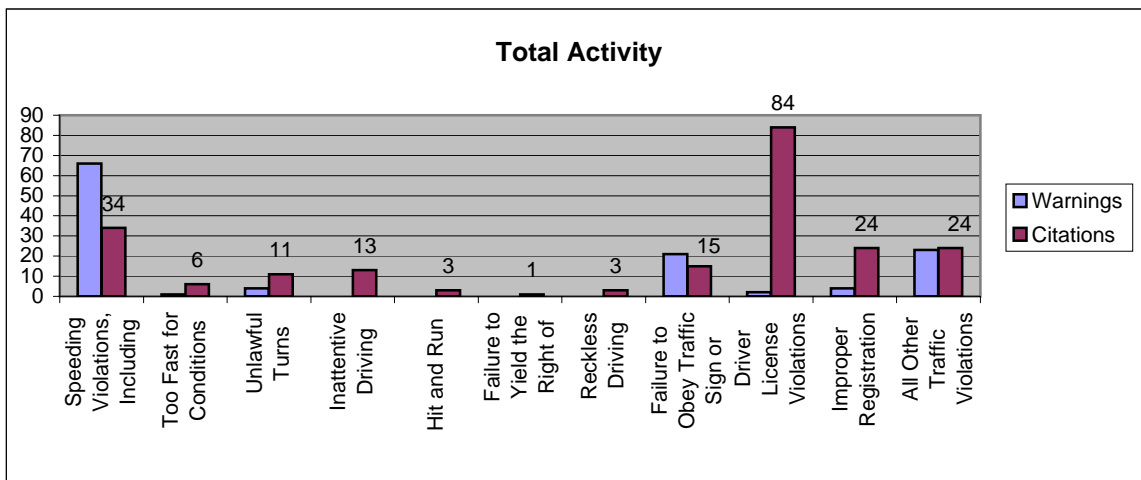

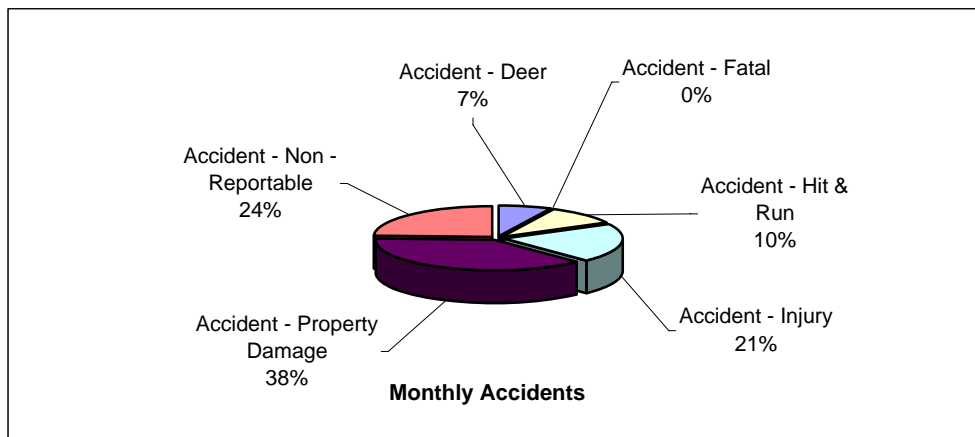

Patrol/Investigations

The Patrol Division consists of officers that patrol our neighborhoods, check our businesses during and after business hours and respond to alarms, rescue calls and other calls for service. Officers are trained and certified in a number of disciplines, including traffic law enforcement, OWI detection and enforcement, and interviews and interrogations. Some officers are certified accident investigators and evidence technicians, while some have attended gang recognition schools and drug recognition classes.

Investigators are primarily responsible for the investigation of major crimes such as homicide, sexual assault, burglary, robbery, forgery and fraud. Those assigned to these crimes have developed an advanced level of expertise by attending specialized training and through years of experience working on complex cases with colleagues at the state and local levels.

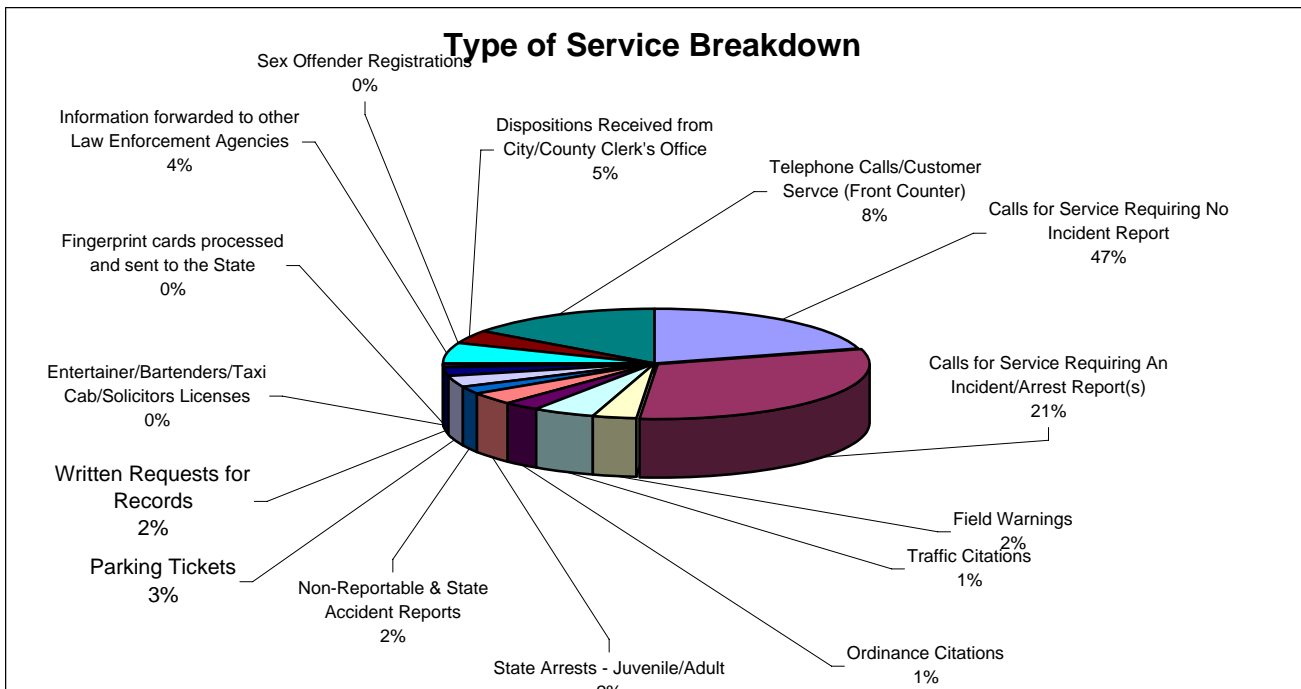

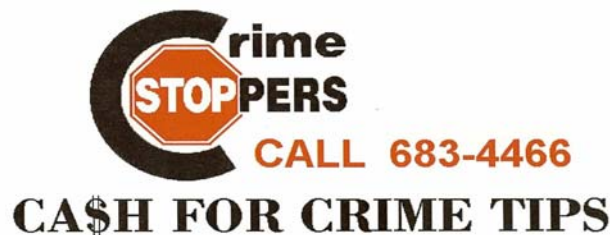




## News Releases for October 2008

On 10-01-08 at 3:36 PM, Manitowoc Police Officers responded to a two vehicle rollover accident which occurred on Memorial Drive in front of Lakeshore Urology. The driver of the vehicle, a 39 year old Manitowoc woman, was driving inattentively while using her cell phone and struck a utility pole. After striking the utility pole, the vehicle rolled over and struck another vehicle which was also northbound on Memorial Drive. The driver of that vehicle was not injured. The driver of the vehicle which rolled over was not injured, but two passengers in her vehicle were. One passenger, a 21 year old Manitowoc woman, was ejected from the vehicle. She was treated at Holy Family Hospital and then transported to St. Vincent's Hospital in Green Bay for further observation, but her injuries are considered non-life threatening. The second passenger, a 24 year old Manitowoc woman, was treated at Aurora Medical Center for non-life threatening injuries as well. The driver was issued three citations from the accident. She did not have a valid driver's license.

On 10-02-08 at approx. 3:33 am, the Manitowoc Police Department responded to a one-vehicle rollover near 1824 North 8<sup>th</sup> Street. Upon arrival officers located the unoccupied vehicle with severe damage in the west ditch. There were signs of injury inside the vehicle. Officers checked the area and located the operator of the vehicle walking in the 2500 block of North 8<sup>th</sup> Street. The operator, a 20-year-old Two Rivers man, stated that while operating NB on North 8<sup>th</sup> he swerved to avoid a deer, causing him to cross into the west ditch, striking a culvert. At that point the vehicle rolled over and came to rest on its wheels. The man was transported to AMC with non-life threatening injuries. The man admitted to underage drinking and smoking marijuana prior to the crash. He was left at AMC to be treated. He was cited for Operating with at Detectable Amount of a Restricted Substance, Possession of THC, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Underage Drinking. ## “Highlights on October’s Investigations”



On 10-04-09 at approx. 1230 am, officers from the Manitowoc Police Department responded to domestic disturbance on the north side of Manitowoc between husband and wife. After an earlier argument, the husband held a “throwing” knife to his wife’s throat, while making threatening statements. Then the husband repeatedly strangled his wife, covered her mouth and nose, suffocating her nearly to the point of passing out. The wife fled but was run down and tackled on the pavement. The husband then dragged her by the hair for a short distance. The wife sustained some injuries. The wife managed to text her friend to call 911. The husband was charged with Aggravated Battery, Recklessly Endangering Safety and Criminal Damage to Property. He is currently incarcerated at the Manitowoc County Jail. Investigation continuing.



On 10-05-08 at 0247 hrs, officers observed two male subjects walking on the south side of the city. One male was in the process of vandalizing a “House for Sale” Real Estate sign. Immediately after, the subject then purposely ran full speed into a funeral home sign causing extensive damage. Officers contacted the subject who was intoxicated and he could not give any reason for his actions. The 25 year old Illinois man was taken into custody for the Criminal Damage of Property and placed into MTSO jail awaiting his court appearance. The second subject was not detained.



On Saturday night October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2008 at approximately 11 pm Manitowoc Police officers were called to an apartment in the 1200 block of South 9<sup>th</sup> Street for a domestic violence complaint. Upon arrival officers spoke to a 32-year-old Manitowoc man. He said that his girlfriend, a 36-year-old Manitowoc woman, was in the upstairs apartment and was out of control. Earlier she had been drinking heavily and accused him of infidelity. Although he was uninjured, he said she hit him several times, threw numerous items around the apartment and she also broke out a window to the apartment. Prior to calling police, she pulled the phone cord out of the wall and hid it. He was able to contact police using her cell phone. When police tried to make contact with the suspect, she had locked and chained the door and refused to let police in. Using the victim’s key the police were able to open the door; however police needed to use a bolt cutter to cut the chain and gain entry. Once inside the apartment, police were able to locate and arrest the suspect. Police also located a small amount of marijuana in the suspect’s purse. The suspect was taken to the Manitowoc County Jail on charges of Disorderly Conduct and Criminal Damage to property. She was also cited for possession of THC. The investigation is continuing. Anyone with information regarding this incident is asked to contact the Manitowoc Police Department Shift Commander at 686-6551.
