

**MANITOWOC RECREATION AND PARKS

MINUTES**

- I. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Brey at 7:02 PM.
- II. Present: Jim Brey, Rick Gerroll, Ray Geigel, Dean Graunke, Steve Erdmann, Randy Albright, Dennis Larson, Jeff Malloy, Joe McLafferty, and 2 citizens
- III. Manitowoc Recreation and Parks Open Space and Trails Plan gets updated every 5 years and hears concerns and comments from citizen input of the park system.
- IV. Joe McLafferty gave a history on the 5 year Open Space and Trails Plan which must be updated every 5 years. The plan addresses current and future needs, justifications of why acquisitions or developments are important and necessary, and actual planning for the future parks, recreation programming, and open space and trail development. This plan becomes the main tool for obtaining funding for the acquisition and development of park land. The process of updating and revising takes many months and we welcome all input from the community. Please fill out one of the Public Opinion Surveys before you leave tonight.

Every existing park and potential park will be addressed for future improvements and developments. We have 31 different parks, and over 680 acres of park land. Parks and Recreation Committee will be over-seeing this plan. Once the plan is written it goes on to the Manitowoc Planning Commission who guides the process and recommends the plan to the Common Counsel. The Council adopts the plan to solidify the process and from there the plan is accepted by the state of Wisconsin who qualifies the material, and provides the avenue for a successful performance list. Our staff will apply for grants and funding sources, when the plan is approved by all entities. The implementation process begins at the point with funding, then acquisition, development, or maintenance of facilities can take place. Over the next five years we will follow the plan and hopefully do as much as possible with the funding available.

- IV. Open discussion from the floor.
 - A. One citizen would like to see a safer path from Fairmont Street to Rheaume Park across the railroad tracks.
 - B. Another person asked if the city would ever change the ordinance restricting snowmobiles in the city.
