Manitowoc Crime Prevention Committee Meeting Minutes MARCH 03, 2011

Chairperson Robert Dewane called the meeting to order at 7:00 p. m.

R. Kramer made motion to accept Feb. Minutes. Rasmussen seconded. Motion carried.

Blahnik made motion to accept Treasurer's Report. Behringer seconded. Motion carried.

There was no public input. Sgt. Jacobs explained that there will be a "Mock Robbery" Presentation for employees of Associated Bank in the Spring. It may also contain a quick change operation. As done in the past, packets will be distributed, observations made, and re-calls to note accuracy will be discussed. Jacobs plans to hold an event every 3 months, with next location being Bank First National.

Sgt. Jacobs planned to have Public Service Announcements on Anti-Bullying broadcast over WOMT Radio and published in Herald Times Reporter, per CPC recommendation during October 2010 meeting. Since nothing was done, Sub-Committee formed with Campbell, Dewane, Scheinoha, Wallace, and Willman to complete task. It was suggested to include announcements about protecting the public against scams.

SRO Activities included Craig Jansen from Lincoln High School. He spoke about incidents in school, such as, Bullying, Disorderly Conduct, Drugs, and Truancy. He stated that the majority of the students are orderly and well-behaved, however, some students become repeat violators of school rules and policies.

Election of officers included: Blahnik versus R. Kramer running for Vice-Chairperson And Scheinoha versus J. Kramer running for Secretary. Dewane and Wetenkamp ran unopposed. Voting took place, however, before results announced, Blahnik declared that she would rather be Chairperson of CPC, if Dewane was willing to step down. Dewane conceded, and Blahnik stepped up to Chairperson. R. Kramer agreed to remain as Vice-Chairperson. Scheinoha elected as Secretary. Wetenkamp remained as Treasurer.
