Chairperson Bob Dewane called the meeting to order at 7:00 p. m.

Public input included two guests: Pam Campbell and student, Collin Salutz. Both were interested in purpose of the committee, and how the committee functions. Welcome! Pam Campbell expressed interest in serving on CPC sometime n the future.

Sgt. Jacobs stated that Dave Remiker, from Drug Metro plans to give a presentation at the December 02, 2010 Meeting. He will talk about the drug Spice and/or Dancing Monkey and the fact that it currently is a legal substance. Jacobs also said that he plans to have Public Service Announcements on Anti-Bullying broadcast over WOMT in December. Jacobs mentioned that along with the two recent resignations of Keeley and Xavier, Joyce Kleppe has also resigned from the committee. Jacobs brought up two recent committee applicants: Lynn Scheinoha and Wendy Smith. After discussion, the committee decided to accept both applicants, since Scheinoha previously served on CPC, and Smith currently serves on Retail CPC. Jacobs said that after City Council approves these two applicants, a new directory of members will be printed.

Another topic of discussion was Crime Prevention Day held on Saturday, October 23, 2010 from 10:00a.m. to 3:00p.m. at Expo Grounds. Approximately, 1,411 people attended. Favorable and positive responses to general floor plan, traffic flow, crowd control, drug drop-off, door prizes, DNR, and LTC student volunteers. It was suggested to invite guests like Bill Jartz and the Fairest of the Fair to attend again next year. Weber mentioned that the cancellation of the Theda Clark Helicopter, due to inclement weather, kept people inside and did not disrupt activities, as in the past. Jacobs thanked all volunteers for helping make the event a huge success.

SRO Activities included John Bennett from Washington Junior High School - He spoke about iincidents in school, such as, truancy, bullying, defiance, fighting, disorderly conduct, and theft. He stated that the majority of the students are orderly and well -behaved, however, some students become repeat violators of school rules and policies.

Seeing no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.
