4) Request for public input: No public input.

5) Membership Matters: No new members. We are still looking for a student from Roncalli. We will continue to reach out.

6) TRIAD Update: April 18<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am they will be doing a tour of the morgue. We are all invited. They are starting their next project working with city hall. They are verifying that house numbers are displayed throughout the city. They will not meet in June, July or August. The March meeting at River's Bend only brought in a few additional people. They have passed out over 200 deactivation bags.

7) High School Members Update: Memphis reports that Washington Junior High is still having issues with **juuling** and THC oils. There have actually been fights in the schools over the Juuls with THC extract. Recently the school implemented an information program paying students \$10 per juul they report.

8) SRO Update: Miranda Check reports they she will be doing a talk for career day at Monroe Elementary School. Lincoln High School appears to be on the edge waiting for spring break! Vaping has become a major issue. Liz will be before Common Council to modify the ordinance for all Juuls and vaping tools to receive a citation even if there is no THC or Nicotine detected. The school district is forming an emergency response team to decide where students will be evacuated to. This is being conducted throughout the county and will involve Sheriff Hartwig and Chief Deputy Knack along with the district heads. This will guarantee mutual response and aid throughout both the county and city schools.

9) Citizens Academy Alumni Update: They are currently on week 6. They are practicing wearing ride gear and are discussing the 20 year mark of Officer Dale Ten Haken's murder. Next week they will be practicing OWIs and traffic stops. April 11<sup>th</sup> at Festival Foods they will be having a fundraiser at the brat barn.

10) Healthiest Manitowoc County Substance Abuse Prevention: The Lighthouse Recovery Group received a grant for \$27,000 for 5 months. They are providing a service for self-reporting Opiate use for recovery. They are providing services in the jail along with Narcan training. They have a meeting September 20 from 4-7pm with Judge Dewane speaking.

11) City Council Update: No new update.

12) CPC Activities/Project/Scams: Microsoft scam attempts to take over a person's computer to get information on bank accounts and direct deposits. The overseas lottery scams have been reported recently. Walmart has been doing a great job self reporting Western Union, Google Play, I-Tune and prepaid debit cards. They are attempting to educate their customers that these could be scams. County Executive Ziegelbauer publicly called the Manitowoc Police Association's fundraiser a scam. We have not publicly issued any response at this time. Old Business: April 27<sup>th</sup> is the bicycle auction. Trilling is still working on a bicycle rodeo. He will be giving out free licenses to prevent having so many unclaimed bikes. New Business: October is Crime Prevention month. We will be having our meeting at the public library and the public is invited. The Junior Academy will be reading with kids this month.
