4) Request for public input: No public input.

5) Membership Matters: In the near future, Sgt. Trilling plans to reach out to a few members who have not attended our meetings and see if they planned on stepping down. He also plans on reaching out to the Sheriff's Office to find someone to fill Melia's position, since she is retired.

6) TRIAD Update: They toured the morgue and it was very well received. Curt Green agreed to do more tours, 12-15 people at a time. TRIAD has been continuing to pass out deactivation bags. They are almost out of bags. They are promoting TRIAD and are attempting to start a networking group between the city of Two Rivers and the Sheriff's Office. They are beginning to work with the Fire Department to verify numbers outside of houses throughout the city. They will be sending letters to the houses that do not have numbers. They provided a presentation on scams at the Felician Village. The next field trip is being planned for the dispatch center.

7) High School Members Update: Vaping problems are being reported at Lincoln High School along with negative behavior. Prom is this Saturday and post prom is at the Strand Adventure from 11:00pm to 1:30am. Memphis reports there have been a couple fights at Washington over vaping.

8) SRO Update: They are working on a standard response for all schools and staff to come together this fall. They want all schools to have the same unified safety response in emergency situations. The UW extension will be where all students will be evacuated to in emergency situations for parents to pick up. Officer Kroch brought two styles of juuls that he had taken off of students the day before. He reported that the last dance will be for Wilson and Washington on May 31. Vaping is expanding to students of all types. Rita shared that she recently saw a juul commercial on tv.

9) Citizens Academy Alumni Update: They finished graduation and 10 out of the 12 graduates are joining as alumni. They are meeting next Wednesday. On Saturday they are having a brat fry and plant blowout sale at Festival Foods.

10) Healthiest Manitowoc County Substance Abuse Prevention: Their grant launched yesterday which will provide 24 hour a day on call for self-reported opiate use. Sunday 7pm at First Presbyterian Church, they begin Interfaith. Prevention week is May 12-18. May 14 is Narcan training at Lakeshore Community Health at noon. They will be ending the day with the film screening of Anonymous People.

11) City Council Update: There are two new council members this year. They are Bruce Jacobs and Eric Sietkiewitz. They are working on a vaping ordinance. The Police Department will be enforcing parking on lawns. Officers can issue tickets for \$10-\$25 for any violations. The only time cars can be parked on lawns is during street sweep and snow removal days.

12) CPC Activities/Project/Scams: There have been a lot of calls involving IRS scams. They have been constantly reminding people that the IRS will not call. Another scam is through E bay or Craig's List. A person will purchase an item, send a check for a higher amount than the cost of the item, then request a refund for the difference in the cost. These check's end up not being valid and the seller is scammed out of extra money.

New Business: Katherine stated they are collecting chairs at Incourage to decorate and place throughout the community in October as part of Domestic Violence Awareness Month. The campaign will be called Empty Seat at the Dinner Table. This will represent that a lot of times there is an empty chair due to a domestic violence situation. In April they decorated jeans to represent survivors for Sexual Assault Awareness Month.

Sgt Trilling announced that he will be filling in at Washington Junior High for the remainder of the school year.
