4) Request for public input: No public input.

5) Membership Matters: Dave Remiker resigned. The Sheriff's Department will be assigning a new employee to the committee. His name is Jon Schwede. We have reached out to the councilors at Roncalli and Lutheran High School in attempt to get new student members. Once we get two members our committee will be at full capacity.

6) TRIAD Update: August 14 is the summer picnic at the Felician Village. We pay for the meals of all Triad members. Last year Felician Village did not bill us. Charlie stated he paid for himself because he can afford it. They are planning another morgue tour, along with a tour of the dispatch center and our participation is requested.

9) Citizens Academy Alumni Update: They had July off. In August they are finalizing the new academy members and will be sending out invites.

10) Healthiest Manitowoc County Substance Abuse Prevention: They conducted compliance checks. Out of 26 checks in Manitowoc, they had 5 sales. Out of 12 checks in Two Rivers, they had 2 sales. Out of 5 checks in Mishicot they had 1 sale. On August 8 from 8-10 am at the Manitowoc County Public Health Department, they be conducting strategic planning to determine strategies to address access to prevent the first day of use. They are in need of more deactivation kits and will be requesting aid from all 3 local law enforcement. They will be educating parents with backpacks on how youth are hiding their drugs.

11) City Council Update: They met and discussed 2 hour parking vs all day parking. They had a sex offender apply for the second time to live in our city. After being denied, he proposed to his girlfriend in front of the council. They are planning on having a future discussion on golf cart usage in the city.

12) CPC Activities/Project/Scams: The first scam mentioned was the i.d. theft. There is not a lot of money taken, more the fear of it happening. The second scam mentioned was the free check in the mail. A check will be mailed from a fraudulent account. When cashed, it provides access to people's checking and savings account.

Old Business: There was a bicycle awareness with free registration provided at the Farmer's Market. They partnered with Baycare and gave out free bicycle helmets and free registration.

New Business: There are 10 events planned for the month of October. The first Saturday of October we will again be having a free bicycle registration at the Farmer's Market. Our October meeting will be at he public library. Hopefully, we will have public input. A coffee with cop appearance along with 2 scam presentations and 2 business appearances are being planned. Trick or Treat safety awareness is being requested. October 17 is a Neighborhood Watch meeting. We will be looking at block captains and pinning our city map of the block captain's locations. We will also be looking into conducting a fingerprinting for our kids, hopefully at the public library in October.

13) Incurage: They are planning a golf scramble on September 21 at the Branch Golf Course from 10am to 3 pm. The cost is \$360 for a team of 4. October is Domestic Abuse Awareness Month and they still plan on having their Empty Chair at the Table presentations at businesses throughout the community. In the last month and a half they had 6 child sex assaults and 5 teen sex assaults reported. Some were past experiences that they are processing now. They have a booth at Community Care Days. Their shelter is full at this time. Their Women's Empowerment Group meets every Thursday.
