- 2) Minutes Approved
- 3) Treasure Report: \$31,192.96. Approved.
- 4) Request for public input: No public input.
- 5) Membership Matters: Committee approved a \$100 gas card for Wendy Smith from the Crime Prevention Fund. Bruce will be searching for a sophomore from Roncalli High School to replace our student opening.
- 6) TRIAD Update: No update. They plan to have a booth for Crime Prevention Days.
- 7) Retail/Financial Crime Prevention Task Force Update: They did not have a meeting this month. Sergeant Jacobs sends e-mails with a list of adults who have been caught shoplifting and a list of non-sufficient fund checks each month. These lists were offered to the board members.
- 8) High School Members Update: Payton from Valders High School reports Julie Laabs is requesting a contact to have an officer explain the dangers and consequences of sexting. He also reports seeing more shirts with marijuana logos on them before school. Christel from Lincoln High School states truancy, marijuana use and the attitudes of hopelessness from students is a big concern. Dylan from Lutheran High School had nothing to report.
- 9) SRO Update: Officer Laabs reported Washington Junior High is having its homecoming week. Defiance with students is on a rise. They are on the fifth week of a ten week Dare course. The graduates are invited to participate in the holiday parade. Miranda Check will be back at Lincoln High School on October 13. Dare graduation will possibly be November 22 at Washington Junior High and November 29 at Wilson Junior High.
- 10) Citizens Academy Alumni Update: They are gearing up for the next academy to start in March. They worked the food booth at Tom Drills Showtime.
- 11) Manitowoc County Youth Diversion Program: They had no court in August or September. The Youth Advisor Board is partnering up with the Manitowoc County Substance Abuse Prevention. They are creating a public service announcement which will be alcohol and drug related. On October 26 they plan to meet at Jen's Java to brainstorm.
- 12) Healthiest Manitowoc County Substance Abuse Prevention: an e-mail was sent to everyone for the event "Let's Be Blunt" scheduled on November 9.
- 13) CPC Activities/Project/Scams: The Dick Weber Memorial Bench is being designed by DeNoyer and placed in the detectives hallway. The city council has passed an ordinance to ban drug paraphernalia sold in the city, starting in mid November.
