

Fire Pits and Cooking Grills

City of Manitowoc Ordinance 6.12 (3)(a)
Lighting Fires - Exceptions
Updated: September 2nd, 2015

Single Family Dwellings

- 1. Fire pits (both portable and permanent) must be located at least 30' from any living quarters.
 - a. Note: A wooden deck attached to a living unit is considered part of the unit thus requiring 30' separation between the deck and fire pit.
- 2. Fire pits (both portable and permanent) must be located at least 20' from any combustible building.
- 3. Fires within the pit or appliance may not exceed 3' in diameter and may not extend more than 2' above the pit or appliance.
- 4. Fires must be constantly attended until fully extinguished.
- 5. A garden hose connected to a water supply or other fire extinguishing equipment must be readily available during the duration of the fire.

Multiple-family dwellings (three or more), premises used for commercial or industrial purposes, or premises used for commercial or industrial purposes with apartments in the structure

- 1. Electric grills are permitted for use on balconies above the first floor. All other grills are prohibited.
- 2. You may use a charcoal grill on the ground with the following conditions:
 - a. You must be at least 10' from any combustible patio.
 - b. You must be 15' away from any combustible wall partition, exterior window, or exit.
 - c. Cooking shall NOT be done under any covered deck, patio, or porch.

Neighbor Complaints: Smoke may not create a nuisance for neighboring property owners. If a complaint is received law enforcement officers and fire department officials have the authority to investigate such complaint and have the authority to order to extinguish.
